Overcoming Obstacles

A HOUSING STORY

ameka Harris. client а Neighborhood Christian Legal Clinic, knows how to overcome obstacles and shine once again. At the beginning of 2022, her family's circumstances appeared favorable. Tameka worked as a sous chef at Eskenazi Hospital. She lived with her two adult daughters and high school-aged son. However, their lives took a turn when COVID-19 infiltrated their household, affecting each family member in succession.

Once she began feeling better, Tameka returned to her job but was confronted with an unexpected obstacle. She began having tremendous leg pain, affecting her ability to stand and subjecting her to persistent agony. Doctors diagnosed her with long-term nerve damage caused by COVID and told her she needed three months of physical therapy.

Meanwhile, Tameka's son spiraled into a severe depression. The pandemic deprived him of crucial milestones during his senior year of high school. Fearful of COVID and concerned about the elderly members of their family, his depression intensified to the point where he confided in Tameka about contemplating jumping from their high-rise apartment. Recognizing the need for assistance, he sought help and, through a combination of medication and therapy, he began to improve.

During this time, one of Tameka's daughters required a medical procedure, necessitating extended recoverv period. Consequently, only one of them contribute could to the household income for some time. make their livina arrangements more affordable, Tameka and her two daughters shared the lease for their apartment. Since they only had one income, they were unable to meet their housing payments.

Tameka applied for rental assistance, with the expectation that their landlord would promptly file the required paperwork. Unfortunately, several months passed without any action on the landlord's part, resulting in an eviction notice. Panic ensued as Tameka believed she had taken care of all the necessary arrangements. She dreaded the idea of her family losing their home and the negative impact it would have on her daughters' rental records.

Initially intending to face the charges alone, Tameka found herself in court, where the judge recommended consulting attorney from the Neighborhood Legal conveniently located down the hall. Once Tameka working with the housing attorney from the Clinic, her worries began to dissipate. The attorney effectively represented her interests, helping to alleviate the worries she had.

At one point, Tameka and her family were mere days away from being on the streets, despite providing evidence to the apartment complex that their rental payment was forthcoming. In a moment of urgency, the Clinic's housing attorney expedited a court date, resulting in a favorable ruling by the judge.

Although their situation is not entirely resolved, Tameka and her family remain hopeful. They are thankful for the Clinic, as without any support, they would have faced this issue alone. By supporting the Clinic, you are ensuring that families like Tameka's can recover from difficulties with a a place to call home.




